

An education should not be defined by socioeconomic background, abilities, or zip code! That is why Jalen Rose and Michael A. Carter, Sr. founded JRLA — an open enrollment, tuition free, public charter high school in their hometown of Detroit.

Next Big Challenge

Fall 2017) for Michigan students is 40%, down significantly from the previous year. Getting our scholars to persist through college is our next big challenge.

Founded on a 9-16 model (to and through college), we are on a mission to not only graduate our scholars from high school, but get them to graduate from college or a postsecondary program as well-outcomes that are real game changers in urban public education.

ith the support of corporate and individual donors, JRLA distributed \$146K in 2024 for scholarships bringing the cumulative total to \$1.774 Million in private scholarship dollars for our scholars and alumni. These funds help decrease the gap of the full cost of college after financial aid, grants and loans. Nearly every scholar who applied for an in-house scholarship received funding for college to assist them on their path to greatness.

JRLA is one of the few high schools in the state that employs full-time staff to work with the school's alumni. Scholars receive the support they need during their postsecondary pursuits with the hope they will earn a college degree or trade certification. The school is committed to going above and beyond what a traditional public school would provide so its scholars can compete in a global economy.






Phalen Leadership Academies (PLA) is a transformative leader in education and is the charter management organization to JRLA. PLA's mission is to ensure that all scholars meet high academic and social standards, and thrive as leaders at home, in their communities, and in the world. They partner with communities and equip school leaders and educators with the tools they need to lead high-quality, high-performing schools.

Opportunities to Invest in the Scholars of JRLA

unding a public charter high school is not an easy task, especially in Detroit.

Per pupil spending varies significantly across the United States. For example, this upcoming school year, JRLA will receive approximately \$9,800 per pupil in state aid, significantly less than our suburban counterparts and well below the national average of over \$15,000. In addition, states like New York are allocating over \$25,000 for each pupil.

Michigan charter schools do not receive funding to purchase, lease, or improve their facilities. This causes financial challenges that can limit our ability to reach our ambitious educational goals and provide appropriate accomodations. To fully prepare our students for their postsecondary pursuits, we need to raise significant funds from private sources (individuals, corporations and foundations) to bridge the gap. 
